INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW 3 OF 2021**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Town Board of the Town of Woodbury that a public hearing will be held on the 7h day of October, 2021 at 7:30PM at the Town Meeting Room, 615 Route 32 - Lower Level, Highland Mills, New York, pursuant to the Municipal Home Rule Law, to consider the adoption of Introductory Local Law No 3 of 2021 which will override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law Section 3-c for the Town's 2022 budget.

INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW NO 3 OF 2021

A local law to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law §3-c

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Woodbury as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to allow the Town of Woodbury to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2022 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the “tax levy limit” as defined by General Municipal Law § 3-c.

Section 2. Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes a local government’s governing body to override the property tax cap for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of said governing body.

Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override

The Town Board of the Town of Woodbury, County of Orange, is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2022 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law §3-c.

Section 4. Severability

If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court’s order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. Effective date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
